

GOOSE CHASE

- Download the GooseChase iOS or Android app on individual devices for each family member who'll agree to play on your team (invite friends, aunts, uncles, etc too!).
- 2. Choose to play as a guest, or register for a personal account with a username & password of your choice.
- Search for and select the Crazy Quarantine Challenge game, or search by game code 97R881.
- 4. Follow the prompts to select or create your team. Do not use access codes.
 - A. If you want **me** to play with you guys, choose the Lawhon Lioncats team and it will notify me when you start a game!
 - B. If you want just a team of your family, each person should grab a phone or iPad and login to Goosechase. Mom or Dad: Go to my Crazy Quarantine Challenge and choose *Create a New Team*. Name your team, add a photo.
 - C. Tell everyone who's on your team what your team name is. They should choose that team at Step 4. Then, start playing!

ABOUT THE TEACHER

Ms. Lawhon has been in education for at least 44 years. Yes, she is 47 years old, but when she was three, she was in an airport in Morocco. She wandered off and her mom finally found her...yes three year old CC had gathered up about 7 kids from all different countries (none spoke English) and she was teaching them how to play "Go Fish" with her deck of cards.

Her first "babysitting job" was at 7 years old (her mom insisted on accompanying her, though she didn't see why). She babysat all through middle and high school.

And then in her senior year of high school, you never saw her at the cool after school activities (you know like fights and QuikTrip meetups). You'd always find her at her job as a nanny for two kids ages 7 & 10.

Her first year in college she worked at a daycare center, as and a babysitter, and nanny. Sophomore year she was invited to

become a student-teacher in the Pepperdine Writing Center. She began to tutor all ages soon after. She then secretly switched from her trilingual International Business major to Education.

Her parents said she couldn't do that, so she switched to Broadcast Journalism & English (Art History minor). Out of college, she worked at an Art Gallery in Beverly Hills, groomed dogs, and did some freelance media for



The Getty Museum. She developed a Teen Talk Show and after submitting it and getting turned down by every network, she went home to start from scratch at KJRH as a production assistant.

She climbed that ladder until she became assistant producer of the noon news. Then she got the 6-in-the-Morning producer position at KOTV. After two years in the News, she knew that was not going to be her "happy place," nor her ticket to her talk show with teens. So, she moved back to Cali to do what she'd wanted to do in the first place: learn to teach. She went to Pepperdine (again) and earned her Masters Degree in Education. She also earned her Professional Clear Teaching Certificate K-9 all subjects, High School English Supplemental, and a Cultural Language Learning Certificate. She was happy.

She started her teaching career (officially) in 2000 at a school in LA called Westmark: the top school in the nation for students with Language Based Learning Differences. She taught everything from 6th grade Reading Practicum to Middle School Spanish to High School Art History. She taught both Middle and High School Drama as well.

She was visiting home the next year and stumbled upon a new and improved Thoreau Demonstration Academy. Brain-based learning? In Tulsa? She went inside. Before she left the building, her credentials had been transferred to Oklahoma and she was the Math-Science teacher for 8th grade and responsible for bringing up to grade level all the 6th graders who came into the school behind in math.

She loved it for 3 years.

[After that she trained adults at Boeing for NASA and Rotorcraft for 5 years and then wrote & published a self-help a book]

But she just couldn't leave education. She started her own school. She taught students individually and tailored curriculum to their learning styles and strengths. 10 years later, she heard an English teacher was leaving Edison (her ole alma mater) at Christmas Break. She jumped in to teach that class on January 6th. She had the weirdest year possible. She came to love her students so much that she vowed to stay with them forever. And the rest, as they say, is history.
